





This did not happen.


The butterfly spent the rest of its life, crawling around the ground with shrivelled wings, unable to fly.

# PRIMARY ONE 2022 FIRST WEEK OF SCHOOL ORIENTATION





#### **Curriculum Hours**

First day of school: 4 January 2022, Tuesday

Reporting Time	7.30 am Teachers will be at the gates to receive students. *Parents may drop child off either at Main Gate (Bus Stop Gate) or Back Gate (Canteen Gate)	
Curriculum Time	7.30 am to 1.20 pm (Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays & Fridays) 7.30 am to 11.50 am (Wednesdays)	
Recess Time	8.30 am to 9 am	
Healthy Snack Break	11 pm to 12 pm (10 minutes daily)	*Due to SMM guidelines, we seek parents' understanding that we are unable to allow parents to enter the school.
Dismissal	1.20 pm



#### Parking Along Residents' Houses

- Do not obstruct the residents' house entrances.
- Guide your child to cross at the traffic light/ zebra crossing.





#### **Road Safety Reminders**

(Students Walking/Cycling/Scooting to School)

#### Guide your child to:

- put on safety helmet while cycling /scooting
- cycle/scoot at a safe speed
- mount off the bicycle/scooter when crossing the road at the zebra crossing
- use the traffic light/zebra crossing when crossing
- lock the bicycle/scooter at all times when parking in the school premise



#### **School Uniform and PE Attire**

- Recommended sets of school uniforms: 2 sets
- Recommended sets of PE attires : 3 sets
- Pupils can wear PE attire on PE and PAL days (i.e. usually 3 days a week)
- Wearing of smart watches is strongly discouraged during school hours.






#### Name Tag

- Iron on name tag to be placed above the school badge.
- Plastic name tag to be put on daily for the first 3 weeks until students are well settled into the dismissal routine.

 Going home arrangement to be indicated clearly on student's plastic name tag.

#### **Recess Time**

- 8.30 a.m. to 9 a.m. daily
- First day of school: Recess time will be staggered and extended to an hour to enable teachers to orientate pupils through the recess experience.
- Students can choose to bring their own food or buy from the canteen.
- Pocket money of \$2.50 should be sufficient.
- Food served from the canteen stalls are aligned with HPB's Healthy Eating in Schools Programme Guidelines.

# **Healthy Snack Break**

- 10 minutes daily between 11am to 12pm in the classroom.
- Pupils are strongly encouraged to bring healthy, light snacks.
- Pupils will be engaged in mindfulness activities before the lesson continues.









# Items to bring daily

- thermometer (will be given on first day of school)

#### **Important:**

Please guide your child to label his/her belongings with name and class clearly.

### **OEPS Pupil Diary & Homework File**

- Every student will receive a pupil diary
- Students should bring the pupil diary daily to record homework & reminders.
- Pupil diary serves as a form of communication between parents and teachers.
- Familiarise your child with the school rules & disciplinary matters.
- Students should bring the homework file daily to keep homework, worksheets and letters issued to parents.

# **Forgetting Items**

#### Set a daily routine and guide child to:

- pack school bag according to the timetable
- look through the pupil diary for homework and reminders
- prepare items that need to be brought to school, e.g. pocket money, snacks, etc...
- © Parents are discouraged from rushing down to school to send forgotten items.
- © Teacher will guide students in managing the situation.
- With the home-school partnership, the school aims to develop pupils' confidence, independence and sense of personal responsibility.


#### **School Lockers**


- Every pupil will be given a personal locker
- Bring a lock (preferably a number lock)
- Set an easy number code for your child to remember
- Items that can be kept in the locker: Art bag with Art materials, mini whiteboards (School textbooks are strongly not encouraged to be kept in school)



### Individual Student Details Report (ISDR) Form

- The ISDR form will be issued to every P1 student during the first week of school.
- Parents to verify child's personal information
- Declare prevailing medical condition, special educational needs, if any
- Sign and return updated ISDR form to child's FT





### **Going Home Arrangement**

Indicate your child's going home arrangement clearly on the plastic name tag.

Guide your child to approach any of the school staff or the General Office in the event that

parent/caregiver may be late in fetching the child.


	Going Home Arrangement	Assembly Point & Procedure
1	Taking school bus	School Hall Bus drivers will fetch students from the school hall.
2	Attending school-based Student Care Centre (SCC)	Reading Cove SCC caregivers will fetch pupils from the Reading Cove and usher them to the SCC.
3	Going home with older siblings studying in OEPS	Classroom Older siblings will fetch pupils from their respective P1 classrooms at dismissal [for the first 2 weeks] until students are familiar with their dismissal routines.
4	To be fetched by parent/guardian*	Main Gate/Back Gate Inform your child/ward the specific gate that he/she will be fetched. Teachers will accompany pupils to the Main/Back gates for dismissal. *should your parent/guardian be late, please approach staff at the General Office for assistance.


Affirm your child by recognising small successes and praising their efforts

**Empathise** and acknowledge your child's feelings







# **RELATING TO OTHERS**

#### Build your child's interpersonal skills by:

- Modelling the use of friendly and polite phrases
  - "Hello! My name is... what is your name?"
  - o "May I please..."
- Providing opportunities for your child to share and take turns during playtime with other children.
- Teaching them coping mechanisms (e.g. deep breaths, quiet corner, stop-think-do) to enable them to manage their emotions.

# **DEVELOPING GOOD HABITS**

Routines help your child learn to manage themselves.

Guide your child to do the following independently:

- Maintain a healthy sleep-wake routine
- Make healthy food choices
- Pack their bag
- Dress themselves
- Buy food at the canteen
- Wash their hands
- Use a mask responsibly
- Take their temperature using a thermometer

Help your child commit to doing some of these independently when they are ready. Check out pages 59 - 61 of the PCAB.






# NURTURING POSITIVE LEARNING ATTITUDES

Developing the right learning attitude in your child will help them transit smoothly into the learning routines in school.

#### You can encourage your child to:

- Ask questions about their experiences and the world around them.
- Express their thoughts and feelings and discuss what can be done if they have worries.
- Practise life skills independently like buying food and drinks on their own and asking for permission.





# CREATING A CONDUCIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT AT HOME

# Set up a conducive home environment so that your child can learn both at home and in school:

- Have a dedicated area for learning, such as doing schoolwork or reading to put your child in the right frame of mind to learn.
- If you have more than one child, allocate areas for each child to learn independently or together.
- Role model positive learning behaviours.
- Establish a daily routine with your child, with time set aside for reading, schoolwork, rest, family time and play.




#### Steps:
