
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#### WE'RE LIVING IN A DIGITAL WORLD

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## **Preventive Teaching**

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#### **Preventive Teaching**

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#### What is Preventive Teaching?

Teaching and talking to children about expected behaviours regarding IT-related usage.

#### When to do it?

<u>Before</u> the problem behaviour is shown. To <u>prevent</u> old problem behaviours <u>from happening again</u>. Talk to the child when s/he is in <u>receptive mood</u>.

#### Role Play

 Talk to your child about your expectations on Internet usage.

#### **Steps to Preventive Teaching**

- 1. Describe what behaviours you want to see.
- 2. Give child a reason for behaviours.
- 3. Share consequences for acceptable and unacceptable behaviours.
- 4. Practise with child to clarify understanding.



#### Preventive Teaching Setting Limits & Boundaries (Sample)

Consequences	ing Star CoMorning Star		
Positive (Rewards)	Extra outdoor activities – tennis, hiking, cycling Extra indoor activities – drawing, painting, baking <b>Expose child to alternatives to Internet activities.</b>		
Negative (Removal of privileges)	Less Internet time. Less outdoor play time. Less TV time.		



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**Corrective Teaching** 

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#### **Corrective Teaching**

... is attending to child's problem behaviours as it happens with teaching and practising alternative ways of behaviours.

#### **Steps to Corrective Teaching**

- 1. Stop the problem behaviour.
- 2. Describe what you want.
- 3. Practise what you want.
- 4. Give a consequence.





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## Teaching Self-Care

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#### **Teaching Self-Care**



\* How much time can a child be online?
\* Is personal information kept private?
Internet scams?
\* To click or not to click on Pop ups?
\* In-app purchases?



## **Supporting Self-Care**

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 Install the necessary security tools like anti-virus and firewall
 Use parental control tools to block Unsuitable content

3. Teach your child to recognize and avoid internet scams

4. Introduce rules and routines

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
